

IN MEMORIAM



DR. SR. HELEN VINCENT FMM, AUG. 4,1931- DEC.14, 2020

Dr. Sr. Helen Vincent FMM, former Principal (1978-1990) and Secretary of Stella Maris College (Autonomous), Chennai was a visionary leader, a dynamic educationalist and a committed religious who belonged to the congregation of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary (FMM).

She was one of the Executive Committee Members of Xavier Board when it was registered as a Society in September 1985 under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960. Later after her retirement as Principal from Stella Maris College (Autonomous), Chennai, she served Xavier Board of Higher Education in India as Secretary from 1990-1994, with dedication and commitment.

Her yeoman services to the field of Higher Education in India and in particular to the development of Stella Maris College (Autonomous), Chennai is worthy of emulation. She was instrumental in Stella Maris being granted Autonomous status and guided the college in the first few years of Autonomy.

As Principal of a leading Women's College as an Professor of Economics, she served on several academic bodies of the University of Madras and on Autonomous and Affiliated Colleges in Tamil Nadu and across India. She also left a mark on the numerous students who passed through the portals of the Stella Maris College. Her life was one of leadership and an example of discipline and commitment to all that God entrusted her with. She had a soft, large heart for the poor and downtrodden, she never sent away anyone who came to her for help. With an astounding memory for numbers and rames she would rattle off the names of students and the year of passing out of the college. A dear friend to many of her faculty and students her demise has left a void difficult to fill. A true Franciscan, her wants were minimal and she had an extraordinary love for plants and animals. Every stray cat and dog became a pet for her!





Audit) A brainchild of XBHEI, which was sparked by a suggestion from Fr. Dr. Thomas C Mathew, CMI, former Vice-Chancellor of Christ deemed to be University & currently prior General CMI Congregation, resulted in XBHEI taking serious steps to devise and bring to fruition the Administrative and Academic Audit process for colleges in India. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) requires Higher Education Institutions to audit both the administrative and academic programmes in the institutions regularly. XBHEI provides this service of auditing institutions who wish to undertake the process. The objectives of the XB-AA Audit are: To understand the existing system and assess the strengths and weaknesses of the various departments and administrative units, To suggest methods for improvement and overcoming weaknesses. To identify bottlenecks in the existing administrative mechanisms To identify the opportunities for academic, administrative and examination reforms, etc. To evaluate the optimum utilization of financial and other resources. To suggest methods for continuous improvement of quality and sustenance of quality in the institution, keeping in mind the assessment strategies and requirements of accrediting bodies. The expected outcomes of an Audit are: • The AA-Audit report be placed before Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Governing Body (GB) of the HEI. • A Plan of Action (POA) be prepared to implement the suggestions accepted by IQAC and GB. • HEIs should formally prepare the guidelines / ordinances for AA Audit, so that it becomes an institutionalised practice. The XB-AA Audit is done by a team of Professors / Principals including Peer Team Members of NAAC. Reports are based on the filled in manual (instrument) and onsite visit to the institution which includes interaction with all stakeholders of the institution. XBHEI charges a nominal fee for administrative costs. The institution bears the expenses for the travel and accommodation of the peer team members. Audits are undertaken all year round. Xavier Board Administrative & Academic Audit (XB-AA)





The following points came up for discussion: • Writing policies for XB Colleges: A group of resource persons for the purpose of formulating policies for XBHEI was required. • It was noticed that some Institutions had received awards from certain agencies. After a discussion it was decided that Xavier Board, being a National Association also could give awards. We need to frame guidelines and policies for arriving at this. Two members of the Board were nominated: Dr. Fr. Arockiasamy Xavier SJ and Dr. Sr. Pearl to initiate this task. It was suggested that we make a study about our colleges as to how NEP affects our Institutions with respect to the number of students, how we function, etc. • There was a felt need to update the list of all the Catholic Colleges. Dr. Sr. Pearl suggested that the list of all the Catholic Colleges in the country could be drawn up by requesting Dioceses to give the information. It was suggested to conduct National youth leadership programmes online in December or January. Dr. Sr. Delia Antao (Western Region) and Dr. Fr. Arockiasamy Xavier SJ (Tamil Nadu Region) agreed to take the responsibility to ensure that it is done. • It was noted that there were many new colleges and new Principals in the various regions. The Regional Executive Members were requested to send the official e-mail IDs and phone numbers of the Institutions to XB National Office. • The members were reminded about organising Regional meetings. After discussion the following strategies for XB were decided upon: Make the church at large understand the NEP Educate the public on NEP by educating through the media Safeguard Minority Rights Demographics of Catholic Institutions to be collated and also request AIACHE to do the same. Fr. Antony Arackal stated that the Annual General Body meeting was scheduled for Sept. 26, 2020 (online) and that notification for the same will be sent out shortly. The meeting came to a close at 1.00 pm with a vote of thanks by Dr. Fr. James John, Principal, St. Thomas College, Pala, Kerala.

Online National Youth Camps:

- a. Dr. Fr. Arockiasamy Xavier, SJ (Tamil Nadu Region) stated that a National Youth Programme is planned on 22-24 January 2021. A separate page will be created on the website of St. Joseph's College, Trichy for this purpose. A contact person and a group of 15 to 20 students could take part in the same. Different Online competitions such as caption competition, poster competition and short film competitions will be organised before the Event.
- b. Dr. Sr. Delia Antao, Nirmala Institute of Education, Goa (Western Region) will also organize a National Level Youth Programme.

Membership Campaign: Dr. Fr. James John, Principal, St. Thomas College, Pala, Kerala suggested to organise a membership campaign to bring all catholic institutions under the umbrella of XBHEI. For this purpose the regional co-ordinators appointed should take an active role along with the regional executives. He suggested to focus on membership drive during the months of October & November 2020.

Orientation Program for newly appointed Principals: Dr. Sr. Annamma Philip stated that there will be an online orientation Program for three or four days after about a month. The Program will take place in the afternoons.

Sharing by Dr. Fr. Joseph Xavier, SJ on NEP 2020: Dr. Fr. Joseph Xavier explained the New Education Policy 2020. He stated that awareness should be created about NEP 2020. Xavier Board needs to collaborate at the National Level with other organisations and bodies to challenge the policy. Fr. Joji Reddy thanked the committee with Dr. Fr. Joseph Xavier (Convenor), Fr. Joye James (Joint Convenor) & other Members for the hard work and generous contribution.

XBHEI Response to NEP 2020

Online Meeting on Aug 7, 2020

The New Education Policy 2020 was published on July 31, 2020 and immediately XB decided to study the document and draw up a summary of the same. The UGC had also requested Colleges to send a feedback on the NEP in the form provided by the UGC. Given this opportunity XB sent out the feedback form to all member institutions to send their feedback to the UGC after making a study of the NEP document.

A meeting was held for the executive board members on August 7th evening during which Fr. Joseph Xavier, appraised the participants on the pros and cons of the NEP. It was decided to collate all the feedback that would be given by the participants and present the same to the full board at its next meeting on August 22, 2020.

Online Consultative Meeting responding to NEP- Nov. 26, 2020 The following persons attended the meeting – Fr. Antony Arackal, Dr. Fr. Joji Reddy SJ, Dr. Sr. Annamma Philip FMM, Dr. Fr. Joseph Xavier SJ, Fr. Leslie Moras, Fr. Joye James SJ, Dr. Fr. Sebastian Ousepparampil, Fr. Francis Parmar SJ, Dr. Fr. Lancelot D'Cruz, Dr. Fr. D Sundar Reddy, Dr. Sr. Pearl MSA and Dr. Ms. Ordetta Mendoza.

The meeting began with a prayer by Sr. Annamma Philip followed by a welcome address by Fr. Joji Reddy. Fr. Antony Arackal introduced the purpose of the meeting and then requested Fr. Joseph Xavier to begin by expressing his thoughts on the same.

All the members expressed their concerns and identified the important aspects that we need to focus on regarding the NEP. The Members made suggestions on how XB could initiate the process of countering these concerns

Finally after sharing and discussion, it was decided and accepted by all present for the meeting, that 4 committees would be set up to deal with the NEP 2020 document. The committees and members for these sub committees are:

- 1. Preparing the document to be sent to the Government: Fr. Leslie Moras (Leader), Fr. Francis Parmar, Fr. Joji Reddy and Sr. Pearl
- 2. Prepare a document of a model University / HEI: Fr. Joye James (Leader), Fr. Joseph Xavier and Fr. Sebastian Ousepparampil.
- 3. Making known to the larger public, through various communication channels, the concerns and views of the Church and Academicians regarding the NEP 2020. (Publish in the Newspapers Get Alumni to write). Fr. Arockiasamy Xavier (Leader), Fr. Antony Arackal and Fr. Sunder Reddy.
- 4. Legal aspects: Fr. Lancy D'cruz (Leader) and Fr. Francis Parmar.

 Justice Kurian Joseph and Sr. Jessy Kurian maybe contacted for their views and assistance on this matter.

It was also decided that the documents prepared will be sent to the CBCI, Secretaries of all the Bishops and all Catholic Institutions.

The meeting came to a close with the vote of thanks by Sr. Annamma Philip.

XB co-ordinator:

A communication was sent out on August 17, 2020 reminding colleges to send the details of the XB co-ordinator to XB office. A few Colleges responded and have sent the Coordinator's details

COVID -19 pandemic relief Work at XB Institutions:

With respect to the response of colleges to the COVID -19 pandemic only three Colleges (St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Trichy, Mount Carmel college (Autonomous), Bangalore and Sophia College, Ajmer) send the report of the relief work done by their Institutions which has been circulated to all the Colleges. This information was requested from the Board members' Colleges initially. To the other Colleges, letter has not been sent out, requesting the same

Regional meetings: As discussed in 71st Board Meeting, May 26th, 2020 going forward, it would be more appropriate to conduct the Regional Meetings **Online** and a report could be sent to the Xavier Board national office. The President, Vice-President and the Secretary of XB could be invited to attend the regional meetings.

Report from East & Northeast Region:

Dr. Fr. Sebastian Ousepparampil reported that they held a meeting in Shillong wherein it was discussed to have a co-ordinator for each state affiliated to the region and to conduct training programmes for these co-ordinators and make it a National movement. They also reported that during the lockdown period the administrators of institutions were constantly in touch with their governments for co-ordinating the work relating to the pandemic. They had several meetings of the Think Tank (East & Northeast Region) and gave a detailed report to the Governor.

1. Consultancy services for NAAC-SSR:

Dr. Ms. Ordetta Mendoza, Coordinator, XB Programmes, requested the Board to consider setting up a consulting cell which could offer consultancy services to members colleges on the NAAC-SSR. The team can be decided by the Board and the logistics for the same by the consultancy team.

Campus Ministers: Institutions to ensure that the campuses be more vibrant with Catholic activities including XB activities. It was decided at the 71st Board meeting to have one person in the Institution as campus minister or campus co-ordinator who would also be the link between the Principal of the College and XB.

Individual Membership:

To the suggestion made by Dr. Fr. Joji Reddy that veterans serving in XB Member Colleges be included in XB, Fr.Arackal was of the opinion that the individual membership system could be encouraged and regular reetings could be held for them.

Xavier Board Membership:

At present Xavier Board has 360 Institutions on its roll including 5 state / Deemed to be Universities.

Life membership:

There are 212 Life member Institutions at present.

Meeting of the National and Regional Executives (Online):

At the recent National Executive Committee meeting, it was decided to organize meetings of the Regional & National Executives online. So far, meetings were held in the following five regions in Sept.2020.

East and Northeast, Kerala North, Northern Region,

Tamil Nadu Region & Kerala South.

The meetings had very helpful and enriching interactions.

Paramarsh Scheme

Dr. Ms. Ordetta Mendoza, Co-ordinator of Programmes of XB was invited by St. Agnes College, Mangalore Workshop on Preparing for Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC, under the Paramarsh - UGC Scheme for Mentoring NAAC Accreditation Aspirant Institutions to Promote Quality Assurance in Higher Education on Oct. 18-19, 2019. Principals and faculty members from 6 colleges selected under the above-mentioned scheme attended the programme. The participants were highly appreciative of the input sessions and thanked Dr. Ordetta and XB for the support extended in conducting this workshop.

In this regard St. Thomas College, Palai in association with Xavier Board conducted a workshop on Documentation & Preparedness for Accreditation under Paramarsh Scheme on Sept.7-9, 2020.

State and District Coordinators:

It was decided in the Executive Committee meeting held on November 19, 2020 to form Regional Executive Board inclusive of State and District coordinators. It was decided to have the following composition for the Regional Executive Board.

Composition of the Regional Executive Board:

- a. Elected Executive Members.
- coordinators of the states (if many states form a region) / Coordinators of the Districts (if region is within a single state).
- c. Elected Executive members of the previous term.
- I. Co-opted Experts/ Special invitees (maybe included by the President of the region).

It was also decided to have the registration done for the Regional Executive Board Members on XB website xavierboard.org as soon as possible. The Regional President, Vice President & Secretary were requested to follow this up.

The Regional Presidents were asked to fix a date before Dec.18th, 2020 for the meeting of the Regional Executive Board with the National Executive. East and North east region has proposed Dec. 1st week.

Tamil Nadu region has proposed Dec.11/12.

St. Stephen's College, New Delhi

Report and Feedback on the 2-day online Workshop on 'Documentation and Preparedness for Accreditation'.

The IQAC of the college conducted a 2-day online workshop on 'Documentation and Preparedness for Accreditation' on December 1-2, 2020, for its faculty and office staff. XBHEI provided the resource persons for the workshop. They were Dr. Ordetta Mendoza and Dr. Joe Jesudurai. Forty five members of the faculty and staff participated. The Principal, Bursar and the IQAC Coordinator were also present.

During the workshop, the resource persons apprised the participants of the various requirements of the NAAC Assessment and Accreditation process, especially the preparation of the SSR. Their presentations dealt with the 7 criteria of the NAAC - SSR in depth, those of Curriculum Design and Planning, Teaching, Learning and Evaluation, Student Support and Progression, and Innovation and Best Practices being discussed by Dr. Mendoza, and those of Research Consultancy and Extension, Infrastructure and Learning Resources, and Governance Leadership and Management being handled by Dr. Jesudurai. They also flagged the need to look at the policy-related obligations of HEIs, and generally emphasized the good practices for all the criteria and related areas. They took questions from the participants and resolved the issues at hand as they went along. In the feedback received, most participants were highly satisfied with the content and the presentation of the resource persons. Among the suggestions given, the participants felt that they additionally needed to know how to calibrate the character and activities of the college to the requirements of quality education as expected in the NAAC framework. On the whole, the workshop served as an eye opener for the all the participants in relation to the upcoming NAAC Accreditation process, and showed them the way ahead. At the end, the experts provided the information presented during the workshop to the college, and offered to continue guiding it in future in the interest of quality improvement in the functioning of the institution. The IQAC expressed its deep gratitude to the XBHEI and the experts for a very successful workshop

St. Thomas College, Palai, Kerala

Three days Workshop on Documentation and Preparedness for NAAC Accreditation was organized by St. Thomas College Palai in with Xavier Board of Higher Education in India collaboration (XBHEI) during 7-9 September 2020. The workshop was directed towards equipping the faculty members of 5 mentee colleges under the mentorship of St. Thomas College Palai under the Paramarsh Scheme of UGC. A total of 40 teachers participated in the programme. The resource persons were Dr. Joe Jesudurai, former Vice Principal & IQAC Coordinator of Loyola College Chennai and Dr. Ms. Ordetta Mendoza, Coordinator of Programmes, XBHEI. The local organizers were Rev. Dr. James John Mangalath (Principal), Dr. K. K. Jose (Accreditation Ambassador) and Dr. Sunil C. Mathew (IQAC Coordinator). Rev. Fr. ntoni Arackal and Rev. Sr. Dr. Annamma Philip also helped in the mooth conduct of the program. It was widely appreciated and was und to be very useful by the participants.

Archbishop Daniel Acharuparambil Memorial Lecture Series:

St. Albert's College (Autonomous), Kochi, in collaboration with Board Higher Education Xavier in India organised the 5th Archbishop Daniel Acharuparambil Memorial International Lecture Series on Saturday, 12th December 2020 from 03.30pm IST. Prof. (Dr.) Isabel Capeloa Gil, Rector of Catholic University of Portugal & President of International Federation of Catholic Universities (IFCU), delivered the lecture on 'The future of Higher Education Education: Special emphasis to Catholic Higher Institutions'.

Prof. Isabel stated that the Catholic educational institutions should be rooted in our faith and as educators ensure that Catholicism is reflected in our values. She emphasized that it is not 'either' or 'or' but imperative to stand by our faith and perform by being true to our mission and our values. Her session lit a spark and fanned the flames among the participants and stimulated their thinking to question their understanding on the new National Education Policy (even though she never mentioned anything about NEP). The new thought that is derived questions whether we are seduced by the glamour of the new National Education Policy, and are we still struggling to find how a Catholic institution will fare under the new NEP.

As a token of our gratitude to Ms. Isabel Gil, an NGO has planted ten trees of Oil species to control forest fires, prevent soil erosion, land-slides and add to the greenery of the land in the Himalayan region whose certificates and photographs were presented to the speaker.

The session stimulated interaction with the participants.

Training for Peer Team members for XB- AA Audit

As discussed at the 72nd Board Meeting, August 22nd, 2020 XB would be conducting training programmes for XB-AA Audit team members. Board members or any serving or retired Principals and retired or serving Professors who wish to come for the training are welcome. Participants need to be available for auditing institutions. 'FRATELLI TUTTI'. These were the words of Saint Francis of Assisi when he addressed his brothers and sisters and proposed to them a way of life marked by the flavor of the Gospel. St. Francis expressed the essence of a fraternal openness that allows each one of us to acknowledge, appreciate and love every person, regardless of physical proximity, regardless of where he or she was born or lives.

St. Francis of Assisi, the saint of fraternal love, simplicity and joy, inspired Pope Francis to write the Encyclical 'Laudato Si', and prompted him once more to devote a new Encyclical to fraternity and social friendship. St. Francis felt himself a brother to the sun, sea and wind, yet he knew that he was even closer to those of his own flesh. Wherever he went, he sowed seeds of peace and walked alongside the poor, the abandoned, the infirm and outcast, the least of his brothers and sisters.
