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


Catholic Colleges Online Youth Fest 2021 DEEPEN YOUR SPIRITUALI

The annual National Youth Leadership programme was held virtually from Jan 22-24, 2021. The programme was organised by St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu in collaboration with Xavier Board of Higher Education. The theme of the Youth Fest 'Go and Do Likewise' was taken from Luke 10:37, the parable of the Good Samaritan. The campus Ministry team headed by Fr. Richard, SJ of St. Joseph's College took the lead in organizing the event. Catholic students and staff coordinators from 55 colleges participated in the online fest. As part of the fest various competitions were organised and cash prizes were awarded to the winners. There were over 450 registered participants.

Eminent resource persons from different walks of life addressed the participants including well known political analysts, journalists, spiritual leaders and educationists around the globe shared their views on the theme and enlightened the youth intellectually as well as spiritually. There were overwhelming appreciations and positive responses from the participants.

'FRATELLI TUTTI'. These were the words of Saint Francis of Assisi when he addressed his brothers and sisters and proposed to them a way of life marked by the flavor of the Gospel.

In this Encyclical, Pope Francis expressed the essence of Fraternal Openness. St. Francis of Assisi, the saint of fraternal love, simplicity and joy, inspired Pope Francis to write the Encyclical 'Laudato Si', and prompted him once more to devote a new Encyclical to fraternity and social friendship and is an invitation to dialogue by all people of goodwill. The COVID pandemic has revived the sense of fraternity.

The meeting began with a prayer by Sr. Annamma Philip followed by a welcome address by Fr. Joji Reddy. Fr. Antony Arackal introduced the purpose of the meeting and then requested Fr. Joseph Xavier to begin by expressing his thoughts on the same. All the members expressed their concerns and identified the important aspects that we needed to focus on regarding the NEP. The Members made suggestions on how XB could initiate the process of countering these concerns. Finally, after sharing and discussion, it was decided that four committees would be set up to study and deal with the NEP 2020 document. It was also decided that the document prepared will be sent to the CBCI, Secretaries of all the Bishops and all Catholic Institutions. The meeting came to a close with the vote of thanks by Sr. Annamma Philip, Secretary General, XBHEI.

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ONLINE WEBINARS:

XBHEI conducted 3 webinars between Jan. - Sept. 2021. The resource persons for the following webinars were: Dr. Joe Jesudurai and Dr. Ms. Ordetta Mendoza.

St. Albert's College (Autonomous), Kochi in collaboration with XBHEI organised and conducted a series of 5 webinars between November 2020 and March 2021 for the faculty of College. The webinars focussed on the various criteria of the NAAC-SSR as well as on the institution's 'Documentation and Preparedness for Accreditation'. It was well received and with much interaction between the participants and the resource persons.

Dr. Sr, Elizabeth C S, an alumnus of Jyoti Nivas College joined the Department of Psychology in 1992 and was the first Principal of the bifurcated PU college from 2002 to 2005. She was Vice-Principal of the College from 2006 to 2009 and Principal from 2010 until her demise on June 22, 2021.

Under her leadership, Jyoti Nivas College experienced tremendous growth. She was instrumental in initiating several programmes such as the B.Voc. and many others and taking JNC to greater heights, which placed it as one among the premier institutions of the country. She was at the helm of affairs during the 3rd and 4th cycles of Re-accreditation by NAAC, was instrumental in the college being given the title of 'College of Excellence'.

Dr. Sr. Elizabeth was a visionary *par excellence* who knitted the JNC family together. She had a childlike enthusiasm and was an enthusiastic learner who kept herself updated with new technologies and developments. As a psychologist and counselor she helped people to face challenges and obstacles when in difficult situations. She had the unique ability to encourage and motivate staff, students, family, friends and Sisters of the congregation on how to work towards letting their light shine. A good listener she cared about each one on campus and the community while appreciating every little achievement of each one. She exuded kindness, gentleness, generosity, respect, charm and insight. Always gracious she treated each one as a family member and went out of her way to make them feel at home and comfortable in her presence.
