National Youth Convention at Carmel College for Women, God 26th to 28th January 2017

The Faith Mission and Enlivening Cell of Carmel College for Women organized National level Youth Convention in association with the Xavier Board of Higher Education in India (XBHEI) on the theme. 'Fostering Youth Leadership for Social Change'. The 3-day convention was held from 26th - 28th January, 2017 at Pedro Arrupe Institute, Raia, Goa with a participation of 81 students and 13 faculty

The Convention was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp followed by a solemn prayer dance by the students of Carmel College. Dr. Sr. Aradhana AC, Principal, Carmel College, who is also the President of the Western Region of XBHEI, welcomed the guests and participants while focusing on the objectives of the Convention. In the Key note address, Rev. Fr. Leslie Moras, President of XBHEI and Rector and Manager, St. Philomena's College, Mysore, urged the youth to feel the power of leadership and empowerment by taking a stand against injustice and the prevalent social evils and in building bridges of fraternity and communion and to be the catalyst of social change by positive thinking and self belief. He also dwelt on the role of the XBHEI in bringing together over 400 Catholic colleges under its aegis for pursuit of common mission and goals in the light of gospel values for a positive social change.

Nigel Barret, Fr. Savio D'Souza, Mr. Milagres Pereira, and Mr. Bonny and team from Faith Works India.

A special session for teachers, 'Teachers as facilitators of Youth Leadership' was conducted by Dr. Sr. Elizabeth Sebastian, Vice Principal, Auxilium College, Vellore, Tamil Nadu.

The top honours in this competition went to St. Francis Degree College for Women, Hyderabad. A special presentation titled, 'Green Ethos and Action at Carmel College' was delivered by the students of Carmel College.





An outing on the second day evening to the holy Shrines, provided a breath of fresh air.




